Utah State Fairpark Faces Financial Crisis

The Utah State Fair is requesting a one-time appropriation of \$750,000 from the Utah Legislature. According to legislative staff, the fair will run out of money at the end of March.

Nine days of rain during the 11-day fair this last year resulted in a profit of only \$47,000. There was also a \$70,000 loss of revenue as a result of the condemnation of three of the fair's barns that prevented their rental for winter storage of RVs and boats.

The Utah State Fairpark is an integral part of our community, important to many residents. For updates on the fair's \$750,000 request to the Legislature, along with any actions that residents can take to help ensure the funding, visit our webpage, *fairparkcommunity.org*.
